ADVENT STUDY: Meditating on Advent with Evelyn Underhill

This year we are offering a four-week study meant to prepare our hearts for Advent, using a book designed for just this purpose, "Music of Eternity: Meditations for Advent with Evelyn Underhill." We meet for a brief discussion time on the four Sundays leading up to Christmas, immediately following our usual 5pm Evening Prayer (and after Advent Lessons and Carols on December 10th).

The book is divided into four Parts, with each Part subdivided into smaller sections for daily reading. We will read the designated Part on our own through the week and then meet on Sunday evenings for a discussion, with each week led by a different parishioner.

Last week we spoke of the story of the widow's mite and the different opportunities to give to the work of our parish: contributing financially, or with our time and talents. Today we would like to put in a word for Time and Talent, by highlighting these three ministries that are especially in need of fresh volunteer support: Greeters, Altar Guild and Fellowship. As simple as these outreaches may seem, they are the very activities that nourish us as a community, strengthen the bonds of friendship within the congregation, welcome new people into our parish and ultimately, grow the church. We are so very grateful for those who have been supporting us all in carrying on this good work. We could not have kept going without them. Now, they need our help. Please have a look at the descriptions below and consider whether you could give sacrificially of your time to one of these essential ministries.

Altar Guild	Team of 2 prepares the altar for worship service (new volunteers will be teamed up with experienced to learn the ropes)	2hrs every 5-6 weeks (each team can pick the day or time that works for them from Thurs to Sat.	Nadine Savoury
Fellowship	As part of a team, bring food and set up (and clean up) coffee and tea for fellowship after the 10:30 service.	Once every 6 weeks. Set up 30 mins before service and stay for fellowship time and clean up.	Mary Hills

While we call it sacrificial, because we know that the gift of our time is precious, it is also not actually our own, but rather a gift we receive from God, and it is indeed a joyful thing to spend some of it working together to nourish and uphold the church that feeds us spiritually.

We are confident that we can build these ministry teams up, because this is what has recently happened with Soup Kitchen. From our brave, skeleton crews who were scrambling to keep this program running throughout COVID, we have regrouped and refreshed Soup Kitchen into a vibrant and improved dine-in and take-out service, with enthusiastic new volunteers. In addition to the three mentioned above, there are many other ministries; please do not hesitate to talk to a warden or the rector about how you could best use your time and talents to support our church.

We also promised weekly updates on the deficit. **As of Thursday, the deficit stands at just over** \$32,225. In addition, a parishioner has pledged a very generous amount to undesignated offerings that will

be reflected in the coming weeks. We were also delighted to hear from another parishioner looking to volunteer their time and talents to parish ministries.

While we give, let us also remember to be fed. Among other things on offer, there are study groups, evensong services, a quiet day, Lessons and Carols and all of the upcoming Advent services. See your bulletin for information about opportunities to worship and study together.

Finally, please continue to pray for our parish and the work of the church (page 44 of the prayer book is helpful for this).

O God the Holy Ghost, Sanctifier of the faithful; Sanctify this parish by thine abiding presence. Bless those who minister in holy things. Enlighten the minds of thy people more and more with the lights of the everlasting Gospel. Bring erring souls to the knowledge of God our Saviour: and those who are walking in the way of life, keep steadfast unto the end. Give patience to the sick and afflicted, and renew them in body and soul. Guard from forgetfulness of thee those who are strong and prosperous. Increase in us thy manifold gifts of grace, and make us all to be fruitful in good works; O blessed Spirit, whom with the Father and the Son together we worship and glorify, one God, world without end.
