

# Financial Update for Advent 3: December 17th

We asked, and you responded! Offerings in November were the highest of the year – an amazing \$42,906.58. Thank you for your response to God's mercy in our parish and our life together.



Parishioners from all kinds of financial means have stretched to support the ministries and fabric of this parish. It has been very moving to witness this response to the deficit reduction campaign.

As of Thursday December 14<sup>th</sup>, the deficit stands at \$8430. That said, we're not quite done yet as we still have ~\$17,100 in insurance and stipends to pay at the end of the month.
