

We were able to find a heritage plasterer, Mario Mercer of Domar Interiors to inspect the severity of the cracks and then to perform the necessary repairs. Mr. Mercer is experienced working in heritage buildings: he has conducted renovations at Province House and was involved in the latest plastering job at the Little Dutch Church. This work has begun and should be completed shortly. Painting of the repaired area to match the ceiling will happen shortly.
