

The Father Robert Crouse Memorial Lecture

Helen Waddell (1889-1965), like her slightly younger contemporary Dorothy L. Sayers, was a brilliant medievalist and one of the first women to become wellknown in the field. Her best-known book, *The Wandering Scholars*, was taught in the Foundation Year Program at one time. Unlike Sayers, Waddell's work has been largely forgotten. Dr. Barker will help us begin to address this injustice.

The Robert Crouse Memorial Lecture was founded in 2016 in honour of the Rev'd Dr. Robert Darwin Crouse who was Professor of Classics at Dalhousie University and the University of King's College. He was a great friend of Saint George's, and often preached and led quiet days in the parish, and beloved teacher of many.
