Upcoming Services in the Round Church

Sunday, February 2: The Presentation of Christ and Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary will be celebrated with Holy Communion (said) at 8am and Choral Holy Communion and the blessing of candles to be used for the upcoming year at 10:30am.

Candlemas is the 40th day after Christmas, and brings to a conclusion the Christmas and Epiphany seasons. On this day we remember the visit of Mary and Joseph to the Temple bringing the infant Jesus to be dedicated to the Lord, according to ancient Jewish custom. An allusion to this child's future begins to appear: "Behold, this child is set for the fall and rising again of many in Israel," says the aged Simeon, who immediately recognizes the child as the Messiah for whom he had waited his whole life. "And when the parents brought in the child Jesus ... then took he him up in his arms, and blessed God, and said, Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, according to thy word: for mine eyes have seen thy salvation, which thou hast prepared before the face of all people; a light to lighten the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel." According to ancient custom, on this day the whole congregation joins in procession carrying lighted candles and, with the aged Simeon, proclaims Jesus as the light of the world, recalling the sacrifice this child and his mother will make when he is led to the Cross.
