


The Fifth Sunday in Lent commonly called Passion Sunday

The Lenten Fast

The Book of Common Prayer (page xiii) directs all Christians to observe the following days of fasting, abstinence, and solemn prayer during Lent:

Major fast days: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On both these days, from sunrise to sundown, we should try to go without food and water during the day.

Days of Abstinence: The Forty Days of Lent (this excludes the Sundays in Lent). On these days we should eat simple, smaller meals, and undertake other forms of self-denial, giving up a luxury or indulgence.

Days of Solemn Prayer: The Lenten Ember Days being the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after the First Sunday in Lent. On these days we should spend extra time in daily prayer and try our best to attend the Holy Communion.

Rule of Life

Lent is a time to examine our relationship with God, with one another, and creation. You can begin this by using the '**Rule of Life**' from the Book of Common Prayer (page 555) to examine your life:

Every Christian man or woman should from time to time frame for himself a RULE OF LIFE in accordance with the precepts of the Gospel and the faith and order of the Church; wherein he may consider the following:

The regularity of his attendance at public worship and especially at the holy Communion.

The practice of private prayer, Bible-reading, and self-discipline.
Bringing the teaching and example of Christ into his everyday life.
The boldness of his spoken witness to his faith in Christ.
His personal service to the Church and the community.
The offering of money according to his means for the support of the work of the Church at home and overseas.

Maundy Thursday All Night Vigil

COULD YE NOT WATCH WITH ME ONE HOUR?

Following the Maundy Thursday liturgy, we keep vigil through the night in the Round Church. We need one person in the main body of the church, by then barren and stripped of decoration, and one person at the Altar of Repose, where the Sacrament of our Lord's Body and Blood will be taken at the end of the service on Maundy Thursday. Please consider coming to watch and pray during this all-night vigil, as we recollect Our Lord's agony in the Garden of Gethsemane with his disciples. We keep vigil until the 7:30 a.m. service on Good Friday morning. Stay for an hour, a half hour, or even just drop in for a few minutes. Bring a friend with you or perhaps a young person who might be keeping vigil for the first time. This can be a very moving experience.
