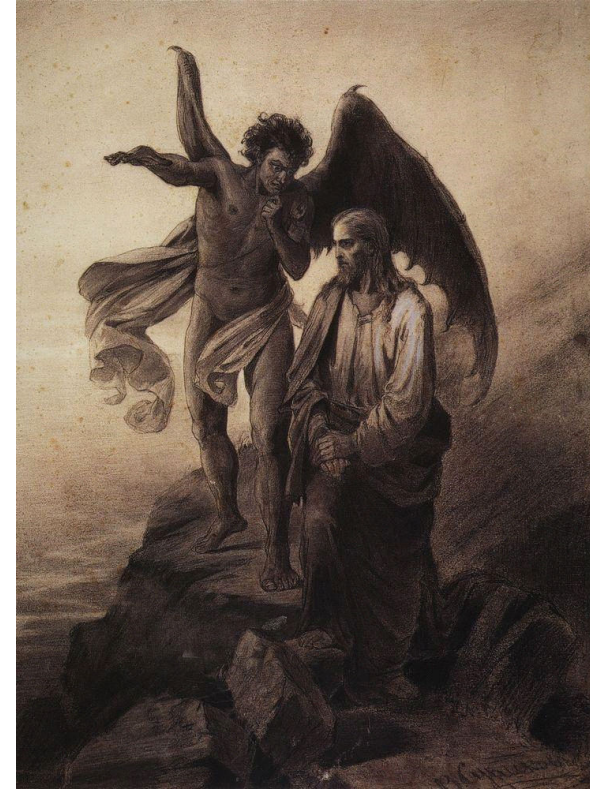

Support for the Kleven/Stones Family

On New Year's Eve day the minivan being driven by the sister-in-law of Elisabeth Stones (St George's chorister and former Parish Administrator) slipped off the road and into a pond near her family's home in South Bend, Indiana. Brooke and her three children were in the van, which became fully submerged in the pond. Brooke's husband Christopher (Elisabeth's brother) was at work at the time. Brooke and baby Hendrik (age 3 months) survived. Tragically, James (age 4) and Natalie (age 2) died. Brooke and the baby are recovering but will continue to require lengthy ongoing rehabilitation and treatment. A number of people have asked how they can send funds to support the Kleven family's medical and funeral expenses. St George's is able to pass along funds. While we are not able to issue charitable tax receipts for donations to individuals or families, by sending the money as a lump sum we will alleviate banking fees so that 100% of the funds collected go to the family.

Episcopal Election this May

Archbishop Ron Cutler recently announced his intention to retire as Diocesan Bishop of Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, effective July 31st. An electoral Synod has been called for Saturday, May 30th to elect his successor. A committee has been established by the Diocese to nominate a group of candidates for election. That committee consists of Daphne Beeler, Robert Sheppard, Jordan Waterbury, Edith Marshall (secretary) and The Reverends Brianna Andrews, Colin Nicolle and Laura Marie Piotrowicz. Please pray for the committee, for our Diocese, and for our Synod delegates, Sue Zinck, Jan Connors, and Father Hatt who will represent St George's at the Synod.

The Lenten Fast

The Book of Common Prayer (page xiii) directs all Christians to observe the following days of fasting, abstinence, and solemn prayer during Lent:

Major fast days: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On both these days, from sunrise to sundown, we should try to go without food and water during the day.

Days of Abstinence: The Forty Days of Lent (this excludes the Sundays in Lent). On these days we should eat simple, smaller meals, and undertake other forms of self-denial, giving up a luxury or indulgence.

Days of Solemn Prayer: The Lenten Ember Days being the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after the First Sunday in Lent. On these days we should spend extra time in daily prayer and try our best to attend the Holy Communion.

Some people are not able to undertake these disciplines for reasons of health and wellness.
