Cemetery Wall Restoration Update

Work on the restoration of the upper part of the dry stone wall along Gerrish Street at the Little Dutch Church cemetery has begun! A crew of dry stone masons, architects, and archaeologists from Halifax and across the country arrived last week and are busy restoring the old wall. A special thank you to Jacquie de Mestral who has laboured extensively over the past year to make this project happen.

Summer Student

Restoration of Windows in the Round Church Nave

You may have noticed that some of the windows in the nave of the Round Church are being repaired. The project of restoring the nave windows began last year on the lower north side of the church and is now being continued on the lower south side. The vestry window damaged by vandals last winter is also being repaired. The work is being conducted by Parsons Heritage Works who are very familiar with our building. All of the windows have been inspected for needed maintenance to the sashes, storm windows, and boxes. As a result of this work, it will be possible for many of the windows to open once again, providing much needed ventilation during the hot summer months. We expect the work to continue well into September. The cost of the work will be approximately \$21,000, already budgeted from the 2022 property maintenance budget and the preservation fund. Maintenance work is anticipated to continue in 2023 on the upper south side nave windows.

Deck the Hall Update

Recently Parish Council approved a plan to have some basic finish work done in the parish hall music room which should make the room available for use, while also allowing us the flexibility to easily make further modifications and upgrades to the space. That work will hopefully begin in the next few weeks. We have the funds on hand to pay for this next part of the project, but donations are always welcome by speaking with Al Wilson, our parish treasurer (treasurer@roundchurch.ca). Thank you to John-Mark Dawson for his leadership in this next phase of the music room project. Parish Council hopes to restart the overall renovation of the hall this autumn after the COVID hiatus. Those interested in joining the committee should speak with the Rector or wardens.

Helios Vocal Ensemble presents "The Universal Language"

Helios Vocal Ensemble, the Halifax-based classical vocal quintet including veterans of St George's Choir, will unveil their newest concert program, "The Universal Language" on August 28 in the Round Church. Music is often called the universal language, and this program, featuring beautiful and provocative Renaissance polyphony from Italy, England, France, Spain and Germany, will show how a common musical language can come out in remarkably different "accents" based on the culture that is speaking it. The concert will feature works by a wide variety of composers including Monteverdi, Lassus, Janequin, Sweelinck, Guerrero and more.
