



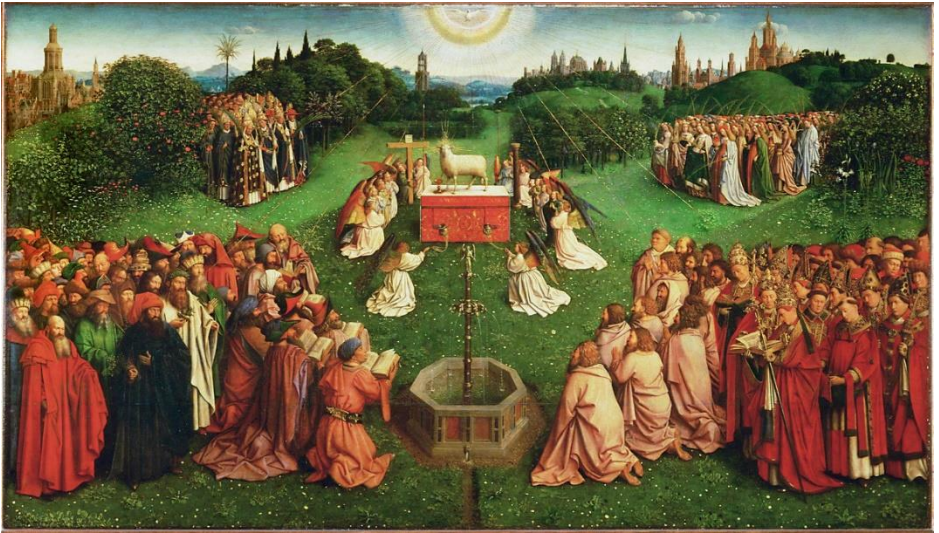

## Update from St George's YouthNet

This fall YouthNet is back to our school-year programming. Our Lunch Program provides 36 youths at Joseph Howe Elementary with lunch each day, thanks to the support of our wonderful donors and volunteer lunch providers. We're continuing to partner with LF bakery for fresh bread for Sandwich Wednesday. Our Afterschool Program is back running Mondays through to Thursdays afterschool this year, with Fridays reserved for our Music Program in partnership with the Maritime Conservatory. Between these two programs we're working with about 26 kids, most of whom have previously been in our summer or school-year programs, or have had an older sibling in our programs before. We're delighted to continue to build relationships with these youths and their families as well as form new friendships with fresh faces at YouthNet.

The Psalms are, of course, an integral and vital part of our liturgy, and many of us feel a deeply personal connection to individual psalms. At the same time, the Psalms as a whole and individually will repay more intentional study and shared reflection. The Psalms are traditionally divided into five Books; we will use this grouping, but subdivide Book Five into two groups. Each week a different parishioner will lead the discussion, with each taking their own approach and focusing on two or three of the Psalms in that group for further discussion and reflection. Our shared aim will be to deepen our spiritual understanding.

## **Feast of All Saints and All Souls' Day – November 1st and 2nd**

This coming Tuesday, we gather in the Round Church to celebrate the Feast of All Saints with Choral Holy Communion at 7 p.m. Fr Hatt will preach. At this service we remember the saints, those holy men and women whose faithful life and witness to Christ have nurtured and sustained the church since its ancient times and up to the present.

The following evening, we gather at the Little Dutch Church (2393 Brunswick Street) at 7 p.m. to observe All Souls' Day with a sung Litany in the graveyard (dress warmly!), followed by a Requiem Eucharist inside the church. At this service we remember our loved ones who have passed to “another shore.” If you have loved ones you would like remembered at this service, please note their names on the sign-up sheet at the back of the church or email Father Hatt ([rector@roundchurch.ca](mailto:rector@roundchurch.ca)).

These two days represent one of the deepest mysteries of our faith, that as Body of Christ our lives are intertwined with “a great multitude, which no man could number” (Revelation 7:9) and through our prayers we seek to be faithful in remembering them.

## **Nave Windows**

You have probably noticed plywood covering two windows in the nave of the church. These windows were recently removed and taken off site so they can be restored. They should be back in place by the end of November. The funding for this work is being provided through our annual maintenance budget which comes from money you put in the offering plate (i.e. non-designated offerings).

## **Parish Visitor**

The Rector is pleased to share that our former Rector, Father Gary Thorne has recently retired home to Halifax with his wife, Sandra and son, Andrew. Many of you will have noticed Andrew serving on Sunday mornings. “Amen!” Father Thorne has agreed to assist the Rector part-time with visiting parishioners (especially those in hospital and long-term care) and renewing relationships with organisations within our neighbourhood after COVID, as a witness to Christ's love and mercy for this place. We are grateful to Father Thorne for his support and continued devotion to our Parish. His work will help inform the Curacy Committee as they continue to discern the possible role of a full-time assistant priest to further support our mission.

Two weeks ago, two cars were broken into overnight in our parking lot. This is a friendly reminder not to leave valuables in your vehicles when leaving them unattended on our property.

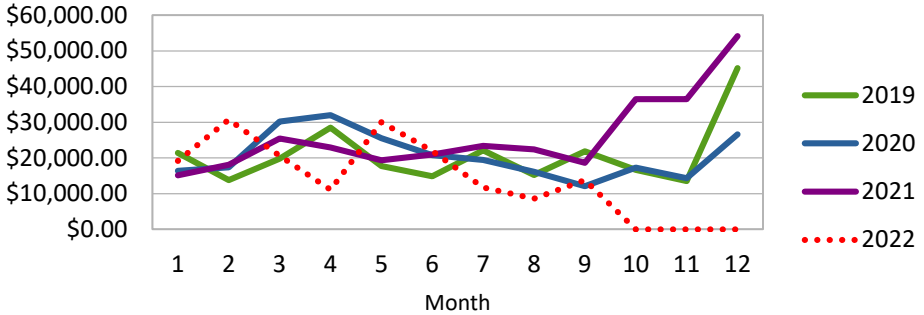
## **Books & More sale – TODAY in the hall during coffee hour**

# Financial Update, end September 2022

To many, a picture says much in little time:

Undesignated Offerings by Month, 2019 - end Sept 2022



The parish ended September with a deficit a little over \$24 000. That is from an adjusted deficit of about \$15k last month<sup>1</sup>. From the graph above, it isn't hard to see why. Undesignated offerings over the summer dropped to the lowest levels in at least the last four years. The current state of the economy has a negative impact directly on parish expenses and on those of our neighbours to whom we give support (and no doubt most or all of us individually). All is not lost. Parish unrestricted cash (money in the bank that isn't already spoken for) is \$10k above what it was in May, and that is a good thing. The cost for the Little Dutch Church (LDC) graveyard wall section is coming in under budget. However, if for no other reason, please consider your giving as to not make the treasurer grind his teeth until Christmastide. If one averages out the yearly undesignated offerings over 12 months, monthly giving should be ~24k. For July – September, we took in half of that. No doubt the LDC wall project was top of many minds and funds flowed that way. While all of us individually and as a parish continue to be squeezed by rapidly rising costs for very basic things like food, fuel, and electricity, so it is for our neighbours.

As we travel through Trinity season towards Advent, it may be a good time for each of us to review our own Rule of Life, and not just in giving (BCP p.555). We now seem to be living in “interesting times”. There will be many who will need our help.

<sup>1</sup> My last update in the bulletin said ~\$11k. Some late invoices arrived late, bumping it to \$15k. We use an accrual accounting method, so we consider cost incurred when they happen, not when the bill arrives. For all of you suppliers out there, timely invoicing is appreciated.
