Tonight at 5 p.m. - Choral Evensong for Remembrance Sunday

Sung by our parish choir, this Evensong will provide an opportunity for reflection on the devastation caused by war and conflict, and the trauma inflicted on civilians and those who serve in the Armed Forces and their families. There will be no sermon. Pray for peace, healing, and an end to conflict. Music for the service will include Responses by Smith of Durham and the Canticles will be sung to the Short Service by John Blow. The Anthems will be Justorum animae by William Byrd and For the fallen by Douglas Guest. Curtis Dietz will be the guest trumpeter. The concluding organ voluntary will be "Pièce Héroique" by Cesar Franck. An offering will be taken for the Poppy Fund of the Royal Canadian Legion which supports veterans and their families.

ODYSSEY LIVE! is a marathon reading of Homer's *Odyssey* over the course of 24 hours. Teams of readers will each take responsibility for one book (chapter) of Homer's ancient epic and collect pledges in support of their reading. The reading takes place in-person at the University of King's College from 7pm Friday, November 26th to 7pm on Saturday, November 27th. The money raised will support The Halifax Humanities Society which provides free, non-credit, university-level humanities education to adults living on low incomes or facing other barriers to university education. Galileo Baroque Choir, directed by Andrew Pickett, will sing choral masterpieces from the Italian Baroque in a concert entitled "Monteverdi in Venice."
