

Worship during the Pandemic

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic means that we must take extra precautions to help prevent the further spread of the virus. While in the church, please...

- wear a mask;
- clean your hands upon arriving;
- check in with the greeter to record your name;
- do not sit in the pews marked off with a ribbon;
- refrain from shaking hands and try to cough or sneeze into your elbow.

At the time of the Holy Communion (during the 10:30 a.m. service only), please remain seated until the greeter has signaled that it is time for you to go. Those sitting around the outside aisles and the upstairs Gallery will go first, followed by those sitting around the centre aisle.

There are two stations for receiving the Sacrament, one on each side of the Communion rail. We ask that only one person or household go to each station at a time.

Upon leaving the Communion rail, follow the arrows back down the central aisle of the chancel.

At the end of the service, please exit the church using the door to the parking lot (side door to your right), or the Brunswick Street doors, leaving your prayer books in the box provided at the door. If physically possible, please consider using the Brunswick Street door, especially if you are seated near the back of the church.

At all times, we must observe physical distancing in the church, keeping six feet or two metres from those outside of your family or household. It is tempting to chat with friends and newcomers at the back of the church at the end of the service, but it is best for people to gather for such conversations outdoors where distancing is easier.

If you have travelled or have been in direct contact with someone who has travelled outside of Nova Scotia within the last fourteen days or are feeling unwell and have symptoms of COVID-19, please do not come to church. Let the Rector know if you are unwell so we can offer our care and our prayers for you.

Increase in public gathering numbers!

There is some good news which many of you will already have heard! New public health regulations for Phase 3 of the Provincial Reopening Plan now allow for faith gatherings of up to 50% of the venue's capacity up to 100 people indoors or 150 people outdoors with social distancing and masks. Beginning on Wednesday, June 16th, we resumed holding services in the Round Church according to our regular service schedule (8 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sunday and 10 a.m. on Wednesday). This will continue until public health allows us to increase our numbers. Contact tracing has resumed at all of these services, so be sure to check in with a greeter when you arrive.

Rector's Vacation

Father Hatt will be on vacation from Monday, July 12th to Monday, August 2nd. Father Harris and Father Purchase will take services and be available for pastoral emergencies while the Rector is away. You can contact them through the parish office, 902 423 1059.

Soup Kitchen Update

Our Saturday Soup Kitchen has been operating as a take-out only service since the start of the pandemic. We thank all those who have continued to volunteer, and the parishes and organizations who partner with us to offer hot meals on Saturdays for residents of the inner-city.

Last Week, July 3rd: Team 3 led by Jordan Gracie. Food and volunteers came from St. Francis by the Lakes. 87 were served.

Yesterday, July 10th: Team 4 led by Alex Bickerton. Food came from St. George's, with the support of Feed Nova Scotia. Many thanks to Team 4 for cooking!

Next Week, July 17th: Team 5 led by Jordan Gracie. Food and volunteers will come from Bedford Baptist.
