Financial Update for July (revised)

Challenged accepted! On July 9th the challenge was set to raise \$10,000 for the Round Church maintenance budget to help with some unexpected expenses. We have exceeded our \$10,000 goal already! As of Tuesday July 11, \$15,500.00 has been contributed to this work. Thank you for the very generous responses to the request for help with ongoing maintenance and repair work in the Round Church.

The surplus funds will be held for additional expenses we know will be coming. The investigation of the water leaks in the upper tier will involve removing one of the affected windows and a crane to get the job done.

While the crane is on site, there will also be a closer examination of some anomalies with the roof flashing above the organ. It is hoped that these investigations will be completed by September and more information will be available in early fall about the scope and cost of the projects.

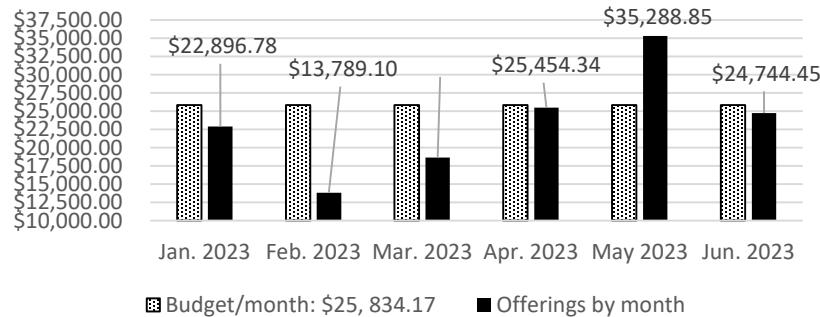
Budgeted undesignated offerings as 30 June: (or \$25,834.17 per month)	\$155,005.02

Budget for the year: \$310,009

Thank you to everyone who responded to the earlier reported shortfall in undesignated (general) offerings! You'll see in the chart below that offerings were nearly \$10,000 above budget in May, which has reduced our shortfall.

We are 50% through the budget year, and offerings are 45.3% of the budget.

Soup Kitchen: Call for Volunteers

We are excited to announce that this September our soup kitchen, which runs every Saturday from the church hall, will be returning to dine-in service after over three years of offering only take away meals due to COVID. To help make this happen, we are looking for more volunteers from within our parish. Ways you can help:

- Join one of our 6 food-service teams to help with set up, food service, and clean up. This is a 3–4-hour commitment once every 6 Saturdays. In this role you will be led by one of our Team Leaders.
- Help prepare food. Every week we serve up to 150 meals. With some coordination, a group of 5-10 can prepare the seven or so large dishes of food required without too much trouble.
- Serve as a team leader. Each of the 6 teams is led by two team leaders. Our ranks have dropped since COVID, but this summer we will be recruiting and training 5-6 new leaders. The team leaders' commitment is 4-5 hours once every 6 Saturdays. The leaders are responsible for opening the doors to the hall, starting the coffee, lighting the ovens, hosting the volunteers that join us from other parishes, and ensuring that all is put back to order once soup kitchen has finished.
