Financial Update

Financial Update from our Finance Warden

It has been many weeks since we provided an update on the finances. Many thanks to everyone who responded to that message! As you can see from the table below, as of the end of May we met and surpassed our budget target for undesignated offerings. We have also had reduced expenses because some projects are on hold, and we have received some stipend, housing, allotment, and salary relief from the Diocese. As of the end of May, we have a surplus, which is equivalent to the relief we have received from the Diocese. We are doing quite well, but the next few months will be challenging, financially. It is June and the Parish is once again responsible for allotment and the Rector's stipend and housing costs. We must make up for the loss of rental and investment income. The videos filmed and uploaded each week are an unbudgeted expense. The annual plant sale and the weekly book sale at coffee hour cannot take place. Offerings are usually lower in the summer. We hope that we will soon be able to worship together in greater numbers, but we still face a lot of uncertainty. We ask that you help, as best you can, to keep the momentum going. If you have any questions, please speak to the wardens or the treasurer.

Soup Kitchen Update

Since the pandemic, the Soup Kitchen has been operating as a take-out only service. We thank all those who have continued to volunteer, and the parishes and organizations who partner with us to offer hot meals on Saturdays.

Last week, June 7: Team 2 led by Mary Hills. Food came from Feed Nova Scotia; 90 were served.

Yesterday, June 13: Team 3 led by Mike & Wendy Himmelman. Food and volunteers will come from St Thomas Fall River.

Next week, June 20: Team 4 led by Alex Bickerton. Food and volunteers will come from St Francis by the Lakes.

Refugee Sponsorship Update

On Saturday, May 30th Daruka Nyantet and her family moved into a new apartment where we hope they will make some new friends and have easier access to schools, medical care, and other services. Please continue to pray for them as they settle in to life in Canada, far away from their home in the South Sudan. Thank you to the members of the Refugee Sponsorship Committee who undertook the extraordinary task of finding the family a new home and moving them during a pandemic.

New Treasurer

At the Parish Annual Meeting last February, Tracy Lenfesty was appointed as an interim treasurer until the end of May, in addition to her duties as Finance Warden. Parish Council recently met and appointed Alan Wilson as Treasurer until such time as the pandemic restrictions are lifted and we can call a congregational meeting and properly elect a treasurer. Al and Tracy will work closely together managing our parish finances. Alan is married to warden Meghan Jamieson. The Diocesan canons do not prohibit two individuals in the same household from serving as parish officers, however, in order to ensure proper accountability and separation of duties, Meghan has been removed as a signing officer on our parish bank accounts and is not permitted to authorise expenses. We thank Al for serving in this role!

Property Committee Update

The members of the Property Committee have been busy during the pandemic doing a lot of painting and odd repair jobs within the Hall and the Round Church. We thank Alan Snook and Ian Porter for taking on these projects. The Committee is also occupied with three major projects for the Round Church: re-shingling the roof (which is now 25 years old), external painting of the upper drum and cupola, and the installation of a new furnace as our current furnace is near the end of its life. After years of consideration, the property committee is recommending the installation of a natural gasfired furnace to replace our oil furnace. Last week Parish Council approved the installation of a gas line into the Round Church. This will occur over the next few weeks and will be paid for by Heritage Gas. The gas line will enter the building through the same openings through which the oil currently enters, preserving the current look of the property. More updates will follow as this project progresses.
