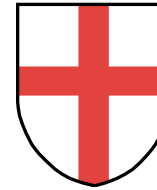

The Feast of the Transfiguration

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration. About a year before his death and Passion, Jesus took Peter and James and John and led them up to a high mountain away from the rest of the disciples. While they were there, Jesus was "transfigured", showing forth to these three disciples his glory as the Son of God. Moses and Elijah appeared with him and the disciples were overcome with the joy of this vision. The Transfiguration foretells the glory of the Lord as God, and his Ascension into heaven. It anticipates the glory of heaven, where we shall see God face to face. Through grace, we already share in the divine promise of eternal life.

EFM Education for Ministry

EFM Education for Ministry is for those who would like to explore their faith or deepen their faith. It is a program of theological education for lay people. There are four years of study, but participants commit for one year at a time, meeting in small groups once a week for nine months (**starting in September**) with trained and certified mentors Gordon Young and Heather Carter. The program combines academic study with integrative components to help participants take what they learn about Scripture, church history, theology and ethics into their own lives and hearts, supporting them in living out a vibrant baptismal ministry in the church and in the world.
