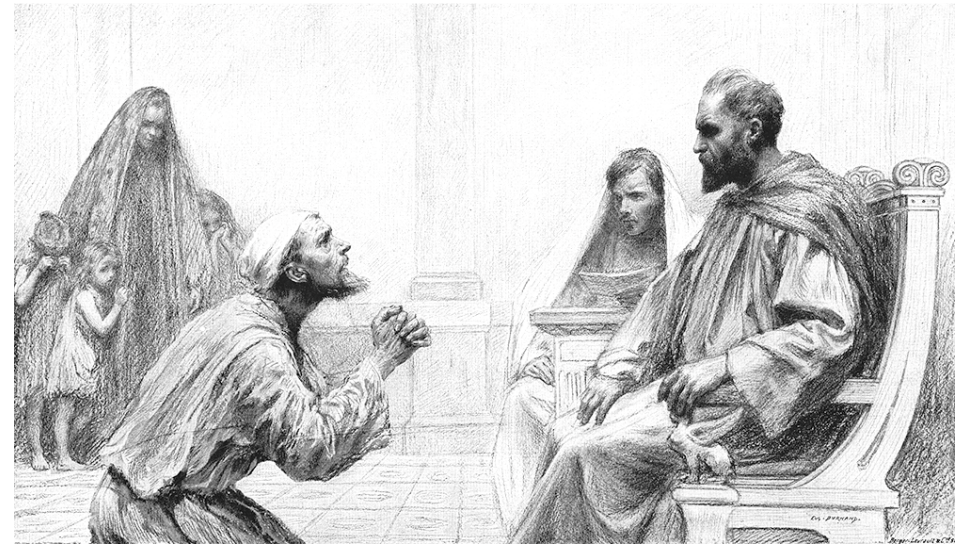

## Advent Quiet Day at St. George's: Hurry Up and Wait

*"Now it is high time" "Judge nothing before the time"*

**Father Douglas Chard, Priest in Charge of the Parish of Lockeport and Barrington, will conduct an Advent Quiet Day from 10 am until 3:30 pm in the Round Church on Saturday, December 2<sup>nd</sup>.**

The Quiet Day will include three addresses as well as times for quiet reflection. A light lunch will be served. The schedule for the day will be as follows:

10am: Holy Communion

11am: First talk and silence

12noon: Noon day prayers, followed by lunch in the Sunday School Room

1pm: Second talk and silence

2pm: Third talk and silence

3pm: Evening Prayer

All parishioners and friends are encouraged to make this Quiet Day the beginning of their observance of the holy season of Advent.

## Parochial Search Committee Update

The Parochial Search Committee met with Archbishop Cutler on the evening of October 10th. The purpose of the meeting was to develop a list of candidates to interview for the position of our Rector. That list was agreed on, and interviews will occur during the next three weeks. Archbishop Cutler has agreed to a short extension to the usual 14 days in order that the committee may gain some additional information, and to have all committee members available for the interviews.

Once the interviews are concluded, the committee has three choices. One, forward a single name as the recommended candidate to the Bishop, forward a ranked list, or reject all candidates, resulting in a new advertisement period for the position. Assuming there is a successful candidate to recommend, Archdeacon Smith will then assist the committee and successful candidate to develop a mutual covenant. When this is accepted and signed off by Archbishop Cutler, he will send the parish a letter and we will announce the new Rector.

Until such time as Archbishop Cutler informs the parish in writing of the new Rector, Diocesan Canon 25 does not allow for the committee to discuss the names of the candidates, or other information gained by being a member of the committee. Once the successful candidate is named, the same canon does not allow discussion of other names considered, or other information gained by being a member of the parochial committee.

We ask for your continued prayer during these stages in our search for a new Rector.

## The Twenty-Second Sunday after Trinity

*excerpt from* COMMON PRAYER: A Commentary on the Prayer Book Lectionary

Lord, we beseech thee to keep thy household the Church in continual godliness; that through thy protection it may be free from all adversities, and devoutly given to serve thee in good works, to the glory of thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Lord, we beseech thee to keep thy household the Church in continual godliness...

In the Collect we pray that God may keep his Church in continual godliness so that it may be free from all adversities, and able to serve him in good works. The Church is the Household of God and needs his constant care and guidance. Baptism is the birth of a child into the divine family. Holy Communion is the gathering of the family at our Father's table. We confess in the Creeds that it is the Holy Catholic Church. It is not its members which make the Church holy, but Christ who loved the Church and gave himself for it, purifying it by the washing of water in Holy Baptism. The true Church is glorious and will be presented to him when he returns, perfect without spot or stain. As members of his Church, we are called to become holy in our lives by the power of the Holy Spirit. Trinity Season especially prompts us to grown in holiness as individuals within the household of God. In the epistle for today, St. Paul prays for the Philippians, "that he who hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ."

... that through thy protection it may be free from all adversities...

The Church is faced with opposition and persecution from without and from within its family. Not only is the Church attacked from an unbelieving world without, but it is also constantly assailed by those within who do not believe in the truth of the Gospel as contained in the Holy Scriptures. We seek God's protection, for without his presence we have no power of ourselves to help ourselves. We must be "devoutly given to serve thee in good works, to the glory of thy Name." We do not ask for God's protection for the Church simply so that it will survive. The Church exists for the glory of God and its supreme purpose is that it may be devoutly given to serve him in good works. St. Paul prays in today's Epistle that the Philippians may be "filled with the fruits of righteousness, which are by Jesus Christ unto the glory and praise of God."

The Church will glorify God if she prays today's Collect with zeal, that she may be kept "in continual godliness", relying entirely upon the divine protection, and seeking to serve him in good works. The Collect is an encouragement to us to persevere as members of Christ's Church, the household of faith.
