## The 2018 Robert Darwin Crouse Memorial Lecture Today, January 14, 2018 at 7:30pm in the Chapel of King's College

### The Soul in Pilgrimage: The Universal Quest for Peace in the Human Community.

Established in 2016, a lecture is given each year on or near 15 January, the *Dies Natalis* of The Rev'd Dr. Robert Darwin Crouse of blessed memory, scholar and priest.

This year, Fr. Walter Hannam will speak on "Soul In Pilgrimage: Stability, community, and the universal human quest for peace." Past lecturers include Dr. Paige (Davidson) Hochschild (2017) and Dr. Jesse Billett (2016).

### About Father Robert Crouse

Through his renowned sermons, great learning, and gentle humility, The Reverend Dr Robert Crouse spent his entire ministry in the Diocese of Nova Scotia and PEI, teaching at Dalhousie and King's and inspiring a generation of faithful laity, priests and bishops who are now serving in parishes and dioceses throughout Canada, the United States and Europe.

### About Father Walter Hannam

A native of Nova Scotia's Annapolis Valley and alumnus of the University of King's College, Father Hannam is the current Vicar of St. Bartholomew's Anglican Church in Regent Park, Toronto. Prior to his appointment at St. Bart's, he held the chair of Theology and Anglican Studies at the College of Emmanuel and St Chad in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan for seven years. He holds a degree in Classics and Philosophy from the University of King's College, as well as degrees from Dalhousie University (M.A. Classical and Patristic Philosophy), and Boston College (Ph.D. Theology).

Father Hannam counts himself among the generation that was educated and inspired by Father Robert Crouse's teachings at King's, and we are honoured to have him speak at the third annual Robert Darwin Crouse Memorial Lecture.
