Halifax Community Chaplaincy "House of Hope"

At their last meeting, Parish Council approved a donation of \$500 per year for the next three years to the Halifax Community Chaplaincy, to come from our regular mission fund. Our donation will support their "House of Hope" project, which will establish a home in Halifax to support men recently released from prison as they re-integrate into the community. You may remember that this request was discussed at the Parish Annual Meeting last February, and referred to Parish Council. More information about the project is available from the Rector or the Wardens. The Halifax Community Chaplaincy was founded in part by David Olding, a long-time parishioner of this parish. For many years, David gave himself to prison ministry in Nova Scotia, offering friendship to people in need of support while in the prison system. Parishioners are welcome to make donations towards the "House of Hope", which will supplement the \$500 donation from the Parish, by placing a marked envelope on the offering plate.

Rector on Leave

The Rector will be on three weeks of vacation and one week of study leave followed by unpaid personal leave beginning Monday, May 21st (Monday after Pentecost) until Friday, August 10th, as an opportunity for rest and study. The Atlantic Theological Conference

The annual Atlantic Theological Conference will take place this year in Sackville, New Brunswick from the evening of Sunday, June 24th until midday on Wednesday, June 27th. The topic of the 2018 Conference is "Memory: Its Persistence and Loss in Christian Community." The titles of some of the papers are: *And Thou Shalt Teach Them Diligently unto Thy Children* (Deut. 6:7): The Scriptural Account of Divine and Human Memory for the Gathering and Binding of the Community; The Role of Memory in St Augustine's *On the Trinity*; TS Eliot: Memory in pieces; Next Year in Jerusalem: Exile, Home, and Memory; and "Do this in Memory of Me": Memory and Christian Living: Recollection and the Book of Common Prayer. Numbered among the speakers at this year's Conference are several of our parishioners: Dr. Evan King, Elizabeth King, The Honourable Justice Peter Bryson and Dr. Neil Robertson. Two of our former Rectors, Fr. Snook and Fr. Thorne, will also be speaking at this conference. Daily Offices move to the Little Dutch Church

The Little Dutch Church was the first Saint George's Church, before the Round Church was built. It is located on the corner of Brunswick and Gerrish Streets, just north of the Round Church. Morning Prayer is offered Monday to Friday at 9 am and Evening Prayer at 5:30 pm. **Sunday Morning Prayer at 10 am, Sunday Evensong at 5 pm and Wednesday 10 am Holy Communion (said) will remain in the Round Church.**
