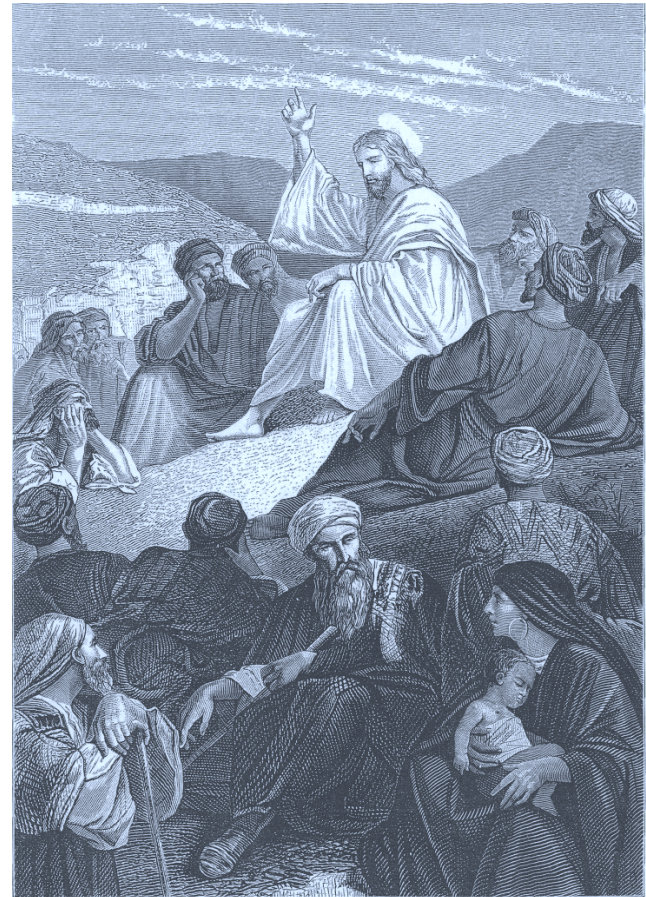

Rector on Leave

The Rector is currently away on three weeks of vacation and one week of study leave followed by unpaid personal leave beginning Monday, May 21st (Monday after Pentecost) until Friday, August 10th, as an opportunity for rest and study. Halifax Community Chaplaincy "House of Hope"

At the May meeting, Parish Council approved a donation of \$500 per year for the next three years to the Halifax Community Chaplaincy, to come from our regular mission fund. Our donation will support their "House of Hope" project, which will establish a home in Halifax to support men recently released from prison as they re-integrate into the community. You may remember that this request was discussed at the Parish Annual Meeting last February, and referred to Parish Council. More information about the project is available from the Rector or the Wardens. The Halifax Community Chaplaincy was founded in part by David Olding, a long-time parishioner of this parish. For many years, David gave himself to prison ministry in Nova Scotia, offering friendship to people in need of support while in the prison system. Parishioners are welcome to make donations towards the "House of Hope", which will supplement the \$500 donation from the Parish, by placing a marked envelope on the offering plate.

YouthNet Summer Update

The staff at YouthNet are very excited about our programs. Anne Bell and Sarah Griffin have returned this year as our summer students. Anne is planning the wilderness trips and Sarah is planning day camps with the help of Chiara Avenia who will also be working at YouthNet throughout the summer. Summer camps include an art and cooking camp, Busy Bees for 5 to 8 year olds, Science camp and Music and Theatre camp. We are also returning to Rissers Beach, Kejimikujik and Cape Chignecto for our camping trips.
