Service at St George's honouring Viola Desmond

On Sunday, November 25th at 2:30 p.m. St George's will host an ecumenical service with New Horizons Baptist Church (formerly Cornwallis Street Baptist Church) honouring the life and work of civil rights pioneer Viola Desmond grew up in the North End and ran a business on Gottingen Street in the 1940's, only a block away from St George's. Prior to this service, and following our regular 10:30 a.m. service that morning, the two churches will host a luncheon for the neighbourhood in St George's Hall. The luncheon and the service are part of a larger series of events being hosted from November 21st to 25th by the North End Business Association to celebrate the launch of the new Canadian \$10 bill on which Viola Desmond is depicted. Parish Hall Furnace

The boiler which heats the annex of the Parish Hall has quit (this part of the Hall includes the Sunday School room, Guild Room and offices). At the last Parish Council meeting, the decision was made to install heating lines from the newer boiler in the main part of the Hall in order to provide heat to the annex. The newer boiler was originally installed with the intention of heating the entire Hall. This will be cheaper than replacing the existing boiler and also helps to accomplish one of the long-term goals in the renovation plan for the Hall and converts the heat from oil to natural gas.
