YouthNet Update from Sarah Griffin, Executive Director

This year at YouthNet we are excited to continue one-on-one music lessons every Tuesday, as well as one-on-one tutoring at King's College every Monday. We are currently building our volunteer base for the rest of the week. On Wednesdays most youth go to Centennial pool, while a few youth head next door to A Tiny Lab daycare where they are big buddies to children at Tiny Lab. Thursdays we are bringing in a dance instructor, as well as cultivating a partnership with Wonder'neath art studio. Fridays we head to the Oval to work with the Oval speed skating program. Sarah and I are also happy to have two new staff working with the teen program, Nyon Butros and Hannah Mills. Teen program began this week, and Hannah and Nyon are already developing a good rapport with the teens. Lastly, three more students started coming to YouthNet's after school program this semester, Bianca, Brielle, and JJ. They are great kids, and add a lot of life to the program.

Rekeying of the Round Church and Parish Hall

Support for the Kleven/Stones Family

On New Year's Eve day the minivan being driven by the sister-in-law of Elisabeth Stones (St George's chorister and former Parish Administrator) slipped off the road and into a pond near her family's home in South Bend, Indiana. Brooke and her three children were in the van, which became fully submerged in the pond. Brooke's husband Christopher (Elisabeth's brother) was at work at the time. Brooke and baby Hendrik (age 3 months) survived. Tragically, James (age 4) and Natalie (age 2) died. Brooke and the baby are recovering but will continue to require lengthy ongoing rehabilitation and treatment.

A number of people have asked how they can send funds to support the Kleven family's medical and funeral expenses. St George's is able to pass along funds. While we are not able to issue charitable tax receipts for donations to individuals or families, by sending the money as a lump sum we will alleviate banking fees so that 100% of the funds collected go to the family.
