Worship during the Pandemic

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic means that we must take extra precautions to help prevent the further spread of the virus. While in the church, please...

- wear a mask;
- clean your hands upon arriving;
- check in with the greeter to record your name;
- do not sit in the pews marked off with a ribbon;
- refrain from shaking hands and try to cough or sneeze into your elbow.

At the time of the Holy Communion (during the 10:30 a.m. service only), please remain seated until the greeter has signaled that it is time for you to go. Those sitting around the outside aisles and the upstairs Gallery will go first, followed by those sitting around the centre aisle.

There are two stations for receiving the Sacrament, one on each side of the Communion rail. We ask that only one person or household go to each station at a time.

Upon leaving the Communion rail, please turn to the left and go through the vestry door or follow the arrows back down the central aisle of the chancel. (The latter may be easier for those with mobility problems).

At the end of the service, please exit the church using the vestry door (side door to your left) or the Brunswick Street doors, leaving your prayer books in the box provided at the door.

At all times, we must observe physical distancing in the church, keeping six feet or two metres from those outside of your family or household.

If you have travelled or have been in direct contact with someone who has travelled outside of the Atlantic 'bubble' within the last fourteen days or are feeling unwell and have symptoms of COVID-19, please do not come to church. Let the Rector know if you are unwell so we can offer our care and our prayers for you.

It is no doubt an understatement to say that this Christmas was unlike any most of us have experienced in recent times. It was a welcome mercy that public gathering restrictions were relaxed so that we could hold in-person worship, but with only a few days'

notice it required a lot of work by a number of dedicated people to change our plans and make preparation. Special thanks are owed to our altar guild president, Tracy Lenfesty who leapt into action and made sure the church was decorated and ready. Thank you to Jim Rawding and Cameron Lowe for assisting with this. Our Music Director, Garth MacPhee and our choristers quickly changed their plans and provided glorious music at our worship services. Thank you to Samuel Landry and Meghan Jamieson for their help and expertise with the online Christmas Creche; to Father Harris for playing the organ at the 7 o'clock service on Christmas Eve and assisting at the other Christmas liturgies; to Jordan Gracie for quickly producing the necessary bulletins on such short notice; to the sextons for making sure the church was cleaned and sanitized; to the greeters and servers for assisting with the services; to Patricia Martinson and Anne Tilley and the Edmonds who ensured over 100 Christmas boxes were delivered to the Mission for Seafarers; to Palma Heming and her team who served at Soup Kitchen on Boxing Day; and to Kim Lickers, Scott Connors, Sue Zinck, Tim Chipman and all those who gave of their time and talent and treasure so that care packages could be delivered to families in need.

YouthNet Update

This week was our last week at YouthNet before the Christmas holidays. In proper holiday spirit, we decorated the Christmas tree and made ginger-bread houses with our youth. We will also be had a Christmas party where we gave a present to each of our participants. Thank you very much to all members of the Parish that bought gifts for some of our youth. We will return to our programming on the 11th of January.

The Parish Office is closed from Monday, December 28 to Friday, January 1st, reopening on Monday, January 4, 2021.

Financial Update from the Treasurer

November ended with another small monthly deficit, reducing our surplus so far this year to about \$33,000. Undesignated offerings (which covers things like salaries, lights, and heat) continue to decline month to month. If current trends continue, the parish should end the year with a

small surplus or breaking even. This means that we will have exhausted the reserve we built up during the year. There are a number of confounding factors that make predictions regarding the finances of the parish more difficult than usual. The diocese waived three months of allotment this year and has applied government COVID-19 funding to stipends on our

behalf. This has saved the parish around \$30,000 to date. However, undesignated offerings have fallen behind the amount that was asked of us in the budget. They are now \$15,800 below the budgeted amount to the end of November. Recent donations given for repairs to the Round Church may also have had an impact on our general offerings. I think it important to note for next year that, assuming offerings match the monthly budgeted amount for December, without the COVID mitigation program from the government and diocese we would be facing a \$14,000 shortfall this year.

Speaking of the campaign to raise funds for repairs to the Round Church, we have now reached the goal for this campaign. Thank you! This is both impressive and important. The church building is one of our outward and visible signs in the neighbourhood and a focal point for our collective worship. Thank you all who have supported this work.

Overall, designated offerings (e.g. the Rector's discretionary fund, Christmas outreach, and deaf ministry, among others) are generally doing well. There are a few categories that are well below the amount sought in the budget, and others well above. Feel free to ask myself or Tracy for details if you are interested. Of note is a recent generous offering toward the Curacy Fund. It was made with a hope that it would inspire others to give towards the goal of funding a curate to assist our Rector. A curacy can also be a place for the development of ordained ministers, and as such is important and useful.

It is the usual time of year where the Treasurer hauls out the books and the budget and makes the last ditch appeal to get to the end of the year without a deficit. I have done more than enough of that above but I would encourage you to keep up with your regular offerings so that we finish the year in a strong financial position. Thank you to all of you who have heard Jesus' call, and helped to carry out the work of the parish and the Church with your time, talent, and treasure. Without all of you, we could not do what we do.
