Epiphany Reading Group: George Eliot's *Adam Bede* Wednesdays 7:00-8:30, January 18-February 15 in the Parish Hall, Guild Room

George Eliot's first full-length novel is set in 1799, at the very turn of the nineteenth century, "a time of impending change for England and the wider world." But the change it depicts takes a deeply personal form for the small rural community that is its setting, when an ill-advised "forbidden love" shatters the peace and challenges the faith of all of its members. We will be reading the novel over five weeks, covering about 100 pages each week. Here is a rough schedule:

January 18: BOOK I, Chapters 1-11

January 25: BOOK I, Chapters 12-16; BOOK II (Chapters 17-21)

February 1: BOOK III (Chapters 22-26); BOOK IV (Chapters 27-35)

February 8: BOOK V (Chapters 36-48)

February 15: BOOK VI (Chapters 49-55); Epilogue.

Christmas - Thank you!

Thank you to everyone who helped us celebrate our Lord's Nativity this Christmastide. Craig Savoury and his family and friends and other volunteers had the Garland up in record time. Tracy Lenfesty and members of the altar guild made the church sparkle. Meghan Jamieson and the Sunday school spent weeks preparing for the children's pageant — a wonderful event after a two year hiatus due to COVID! Anne Tilley spent months collecting items for the Shoeboxes for Seafarers and made sure they were delivered to the Mission. Jordan Gracie and Tim Chipman and others made sure the Soup Kitchen carried on and served a hot meal on the afternoon of December 24th. We are blessed with a multitude of riches.

Hall Music Room Update

The ongoing renovation of the new music room in the parish hall stalled for a number of weeks while we searched for carpenters who could do the work needed to reinforce the ceiling before the finish work in the room could begin. We finally secured a carpenter and additional labourers through Edmonds Landscaping and work resumed two weeks ago. It has involved extensive (and very messy) demolition of an old sound barrier between the ceiling and the floor of upstairs hall, along with the removal of old abandoned gas lines buried under the floor boards from the days when the Halifax Gas, Light and Water Company supplied much of the area from the coal gas plant. The building has a lot of history! Thank you to Terry, Willie, Eric, Justin and other labourers from Edmonds who have been carrying out this work and to Steve Bezanson who has spent many long hours labouring over architectural drawings, coordinating with the engineer, sourcing materials, and supervising the work on a daily basis. Hopefully this work will be completed in early January after which the initial finishing work (e.g. new walls, doors, sound proofing) on the room can begin.

Christmas Family Outreach Update

This year we delivered gifts and food for Christmas to 26 families and individuals (including 52 children) in need in our neighbourhood and beyond. Thank you to Kim Lickers for her leadership again this year, and to the wonderful team of volunteers who showed up to wrap and deliver. It was also a wonderful opportunity to welcome and enjoy fellowship with many of the new families and individuals who have joined our congregation in the past few months and for others to reconnect after the isolation brought about by COVID. Praise God for these mercies.
