## The Lenten Fast

The Book of Common Prayer (page xiii) directs all Christians to observe the following days of fasting, abstinence, and solemn prayer during Lent:

*Major fast days:* Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On both these days, from sunrise to sundown, we should try to go without food and water during the day.

*Days of Abstinence:* The Forty Days of Lent (this excludes the Sundays in Lent). On these days we should eat simple, smaller meals, and undertake other forms of self-denial, giving up a luxury or indulgence.

*Days of Solemn Prayer:* The Lenten Ember Days being the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after the First Sunday in Lent. On these days we should spend extra time in daily prayer and try our best to attend the Holy Communion.

## Rule of Life

Lent is a time to examine our relationship with God, with one another, and creation. You can begin this by using the '**Rule of Life**' from the Book of Common Prayer (page 555) to examine your life:

Every Christian man or woman should from time to time frame for himself a RULE OF LIFE in accordance with the precepts of the Gospel and the faith and order of the Church; wherein he may consider the following:

The regularity of his attendance at public worship and especially at the holy Communion.

The practice of private prayer, Bible-reading, and self-discipline.

Bringing the teaching and example of Christ into his everyday life.

The boldness of his spoken witness to his faith in Christ.

His personal service to the Church and the community.

The offering of money according to his means for the support of the work of the Church at home and overseas.

## Update from the Parish AGM

Last Sunday was our Annual General Meeting. We welcome the following newly elected Parish Council members: Kara Holm, Matthew Vanderkwaak, Marilyn Orr, Nic Lucciola, and Cameron Lowe. Thank you to them for agreeing to serve. We bid our thanks to Nathan McAllister who completed his term as warden and to our auditors for the past two years, Anne Snook and Sarah Stevenson. The budget for 2022 was passed and is largely consistent with last year's budget except for funds for the restoration of part of the Gerrish Street wall at the Little Dutch Church cemetery which we expect to raise mostly through grants. The parish decided to use \$6,000 of the \$35,000 surplus from last year to finish the modest renovations to the Trinity House kitchen and to set aside the remainder of the surplus as contingency fund to be used at the discretion of Parish Council, especially for unforeseen property expenses or improvements.
