



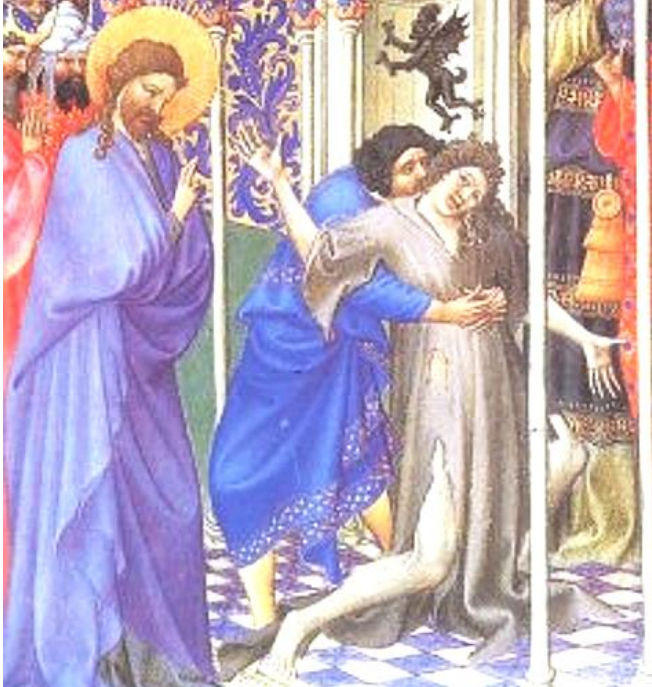

LENT 2023

Lent begins this Wednesday, February 22nd. Lent is a journey into the love of the Cross. Let us take up our Lenten disciplines and renew our love for God and His world. Below are some ways in which you might do so in our parish.

"I therefore invite you, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance, by prayer, fasting, and self-denial, and by reading and meditation upon God's holy Word." (From the Book of Common Prayer, p. 612)

Rule of Life

Lent is a time to examine our relationship with God, with one another, and creation. You can begin this by using the 'Rule of Life' from the Book of Common Prayer (page 555) to examine your life:

Every Christian man or woman should from time to time frame for himself a RULE OF LIFE in accordance with the precepts of the Gospel and the faith and order of the Church; wherein he may consider the following:

The regularity of his attendance at public worship and especially at the holy Communion.

The practice of private prayer, Bible-reading, and self-discipline.

Bringing the teaching and example of Christ into his everyday life.

The boldness of his spoken witness to his faith in Christ.

His personal service to the Church and the community.

The offering of money according to his means for the support of the work of the Church at home and overseas.

Lenten Quiet Day

Saturday, March 25th (Feast of the Annunciation) from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The Rev'd Mark Harris will lead a quiet day guiding us through the Psalms and, in particular, the Psalms of Lament. What might these ancient prayers have to teach us about learning to live faithfully through seasons of trial and upheaval, individually and collectively? How may they point us toward a robust theology of discomfort?

The day will begin with a celebration of the Holy Communion followed by a series of talks and time for silence, and conclude with a soup luncheon and time for fellowship.

2023 Atlantic Theological Conference

The parish has been a sustaining feature of the Church's witness for centuries. It identifies not only a building and a community of regular church-goers; it embraces an entire locality, with its varying seasons and transformations, its enduring memories and aspirations, and knits them together around a centre of prayer and sacrament. For many it is a ubiquitous structure of Christian experience, the site of all our comings and goings, but the very invisibility of its blessings means that its presence is often overlooked. This Conference examines the roots of parish life, and invites us to consider the challenges that face it and the possibilities that lie before it.
