Financial Update from the Treasurer

The parish ended April with a deficit of \$16,796.91. The bulk of the deficit can be accounted for by property expenditures for heating and repairs which are not distributed evenly over the year. Our Property committee is always on the ball and has made good progress on property maintenance since the budget was approved at the Annual General Meeting last February. A large amount of the annual heating costs occur in the January to March timeframe. If one takes into account these costs versus the budgeted amounts for maintenance and repairs averaged over 12 months, they account for about \$15,000 of the "deficit". In other words, if we pro-rate these property costs across the whole of the year, the parish is about breaking even.

Soup Kitchen Update

Our Saturday Soup Kitchen has been operating as a take-out only service since the start of the pandemic. We thank all those who have continued to volunteer, and the parishes and organizations who partner with us to offer hot meals on Saturdays for residents of the inner-city.

Last Week, May 28: Team 2 led by Mary Hills. Food and volunteers came from St. John's United, Fall River; 99 were served.

Yesterday, June 4: Team 3 led by Jordan Gracie. Food and volunteers came from St. Mark's Anglican.

Next week, June 11: Team 4 led by Alex Bickerton. Food and volunteers will be supplied by St. George's.

The parish office will be closed this Monday to allow a day off this week for our Parish Administrator who is leading Soup Kitchen on Saturday.

Parish Choir Concert – June 19 at 7pm

Featuring G. F. Handel's 'Utrecht' Te Deum.

On Sunday, June 19th at 7pm the Parish Choir will present G. F. Handel's 'Utrecht' Te Deum. This festive work was composed by Handel in celebration of the Peace Treaty of Utrecht, marking the end of the War of Spanish Succession in 1713. It was first performed in St Paul's Cathedral in London in July of 1713. Richly scored for soloists, choir, strings, trumpets, oboes, flauto traverso, bassoon and continuo, the Utrecht Te Deum will be a feast for the senses. This concert is the first of its scale since the choir performed Bach's Magnificat in D, just weeks before the Pandemic reached our shores. Admission will be a suggested donation of \$20. Proceeds will be directed to the Friends of Saint George's Society, toward the Music Programme. Cheques should be made out to the “Friends of St. George's Society.”

Daily Offices move to the Little Dutch Church

The Daily Offices of Morning and Evening Prayer (Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.) and Evening Prayer on Sundays will be said in the Little Dutch Church, at the corner of Brunswick and Gerrish Streets until the end of September. Consecrated in 1761, the building dates from the 1750s (or perhaps earlier, and served as both the first Saint George's church before the Round Church was built in the early 1800s, and as the first location of St. George's Charitable School before the construction of the hall in the 1880's.

Service Honouring the Queen's Platinum Jubilee

Today at 4 p.m. at All Saints' Cathedral

The Cathedral Choir, with Curtis Dietz on trumpet, will offer a special service honouring the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. This service will feature music from the Queen's Coronation service at Westminster Abbey in 1953, with works by such luminaries as Vaughan Williams, Orlando Gibbons, William Byrd, Hubert Parry and William Walton. Canada's own Healey Willan was represented in that service with his fine setting of “O Lord Our Governor”. The service will also include prayers and readings appropriate to the occasion, and a brief address by the Lieutenant-Governor.
