Patronal Festival - the Feast of Saint George

Today is our Patronal Festival! Today, we celebrate the gifts of God made manifest in His servant, Saint George, the patron and protector of our parish. We are grateful to borrow the banner of Saint George from the King's College Chapel. It was commissioned in the mid-2010s in memory of the Rev'd Dr Robert Crouse, a great friend to our parish. The flag of Saint George also flies from our flagpole today, given to the Glory of God and in loving memory of Larry Miles by Maxine Miles. Today in Sunday School our children will be learning about Saint George, and you may even see a Roman solider or a dragon wandering about...

Who was Saint George?

St George the Martyr was born in Cappadocia in the third century, and served in the Roman army under Diocletian. He is generally supposed to have been the young man who tore down the edicts against the Christians which the Emperor had caused to be affixed to the door of the church of Nicomedia, and to have suffered death in consequence. George was revered in the East (by both Christians and Muslims) and medieval crusaders returning from their journeys brought his cult back to England. In 1220, at the Synod of Oxford he was chosen as the patron saint of England, supplanting Edward the Confessor. George is usually represented in conflict with a dragon, in allusion to his legendary fight to save a princess from being sacrificed to propitiate a monster. The story, doubtless an adaptation of the ancient Greek story of Perseus and Andromeda, symbolizes the triumph of Christ over the power of Satan.

One of the most satisfying (and important!) volunteer positions at St. George's is that of a greeter at the 10:30 am Sunday services. Greeters get to meet everyone attending the service, give them their bulletins, choice of prayer and hymn books, count the congregants, collect the offering and bid congregants farewell at the end of the service. This ministry is especially important for helping new comers and visitors feel welcome at our services. We ask for our Greeters' availability every 2 months in advance so it is easy to have a flexible schedule throughout the year - Greeters are usually scheduled to greet only a couple of times, of their choosing, every 2 months. Once in a while there are special services at which we would like a Greeter to be present but, again, it is only if volunteers are available. And, if something comes up where you can't make your scheduled service, you can easily switch with someone else - doesn't get much easier than that. We will also provide "on the job training"! Today - Reopening of New Horizons Baptist Church

This week our neighbours at New Horizons Baptist Church have been celebrating their 191st Church Anniversary and the Grand Reopening of their building after more than four years of renovations, which now includes the Richard Preston Centre for Excellence. During their renovation, St George's provided them with office and meeting space and they used the Round Church on occasion for worship. It has been a joy to develop closer friendship with them over the past few years. All are welcome to join Father Hatt at New Horizons today at 3:30 p.m. for their community-wide service of worship in thanksgiving for their new space and to pray for many more years of their faithful ministry in the community.

Completion of Little Dutch Church Wall Restoration projected in 2023

We have recently heard from Parks Canada that we were successful in our application for funding to complete the restoration of the Gerrish Street dry stone retaining walls along the southern boundary of the Little Dutch Church historic graveyard. Discussions with our partners, the masons of DryStone Canada, and our architects, archaeologists and conservation specialist in Halifax are underway. Work is due to take place this August-September. The total cost of Phase 2 is estimated at \$350,000; Parks Canada guarantees one half of all eligible costs. A few of the applications for matching funds have been approved; we await the decision of others while continuing to pursue other sources of funding. Please be aware that the estimated costs include 20% contingency funds. The work in 2022 came in at \$139,000, well below the estimate of \$240,000.

This year's work includes a longer stretch of wall (110m vs 75m) and coping stones to cover the entire span. However, we approach the work this year with a proven team, and the experience and knowledge of the wall acquired during last year's efforts.

If you haven't yet done so, do take a walk along Brunswick Street to the site of the first St. George's, our spiritual ancestors, and see what was accomplished in 2022, and the state of the remaining walls. It is a measure of the competence of the masons over 250 years ago that the walls have lasted this long. Here's to another 250 years!

Singing Gregorian Chant: An Introductory Workshop

Presented by the Holy Heart Schola Cantorum and hosted by the Atlantic School of Theology, this workshop will introduce participants to Gregorian chant and its nature, forms, and functions in the liturgy. Participants will leave equipped with ideas for introducing chant in a church setting. Following the workshop, they will have the opportunity to attend and participate in sung Vespers which will include many of the chants learned during the workshop. **About Holy Heart Schola Cantorum:** The Holy Heart Schola Cantorum is Halifax's only mens' choir specifically focused on singing Gregorian Chant, primarily in a liturgical context. They have been singing together regularly since 2007.
