# **Update from the Finance Warden**

Last month we reported that our parish had accumulated a small surplus. I am happy to report that the surplus has continued to grow to approximately \$35,000 as of the end of July. There are several reasons for this surplus. As we have been reporting throughout the spring and summer, we are receiving a wage subsidy from the federal government for the Rector's stipend and housing. This will most likely continue to the end of 2020, although the Diocese must re-apply for it every month. Since the pandemic began, we also severely restricted our expenses, with the result that they are slightly lower than budgeted. We have also been meeting our budgeted target for undesignated offerings. If we can continue with this momentum in the fall, we should end the year in a strong financial position. Thank you to all who have supported the parish so faithfully during these uncertain times.

# **Worship during the Pandemic**

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic means that we must take extra precautions to care for our neighbour and help prevent the further spread of the virus. While in the church, please...

- wear a mask. Please speak to a greeter if you need one.
- clean your hands upon arriving in the church (hand sanitizer is available at the door)
- check-in with the greeter and make sure your name is recorded (this is required in the event that health authorities need to conduct contact tracing)
- refrain from sitting in the pews marked off with a ribbon
- refrain from shaking others' hands
- cough or sneeze into your elbow
- at the time of Communion during the 10:30 a.m. service, we ask that members of the congregation remain in their pews until the greeter or sidesperson has indicated that it is time for them to go forward. This is necessary to ensure we maintain proper physical distancing while in line to receive the Sacrament, now that there are larger numbers of people attending.
- exit the church using the vestry door (side door to your left) and drop your prayer book in the box at the door.

At all times, please observe physical distancing in the church, keeping six feet or two metres from those outside of your family or household. This is especially important when arriving or leaving the church and when approaching the altar to receive the Holy Communion.

If you have travelled or have been in direct contact with someone who has travelled outside of Nova Scotia or the Atlantic 'bubble' within the last fourteen days, or are feeling unwell and have symptoms of COVID-19 please do not come to church. Let the Rector know if you are unwell so we can offer our care and our prayers for you!

# **Update on Repairs to the Round Church**

This summer we have undertaken three major maintenance projects in the Round Church. The first is the installation of a new natural gas furnace which was completed this week. Our old oil furnace and oil tanks had reached their end-of-life and were at risk of failing during the coming winter. Give thanks for a generous donor who has provided the resources which enabled us to undertake this project in such a timely fashion.

The second project is the painting of the upper exterior portion of the drum and the cupola. This work is well underway and should be finished in the next few weeks. Some rotten wood was found at the base of the cupola, but it was caught early and can be repaired fairly easily. The third project is the re-shingling of the church roof. After nearly twenty-five years, the shingles are close to their end-of-life and need to be replaced before winter. This work is scheduled to begin in September and should last for a few weeks. This will involve the placement of staging around the church while the work is being done, but it should not be very disruptive.

# **Appeal for Funds for Repairs**

The total cost of the exterior painting and the re-shingling of the church is approximately \$80,000. We received a grant of \$10,000 from the Province of Nova Scotia and a grant of \$25,000 from the Municipality towards these two projects. Last week, Parish Council approved the transfer of \$20,000 from our short-term Preservation Fund to help pay for these projects. These monies are funds which have accumulated from the interest of the Preservation Endowment and can only be spent on the maintenance of the Round Church. This means that we have an overall shortfall of \$25,000 which we need to raise ourselves. Please consider making a donation to help cover these costs. Let us give thanks that we have been blessed as a congregation with the resources to maintain this national historic site with love for God and for this neighbourhood.
