## This Week -- Feast of the Annunciation

The Feast of the Annunciation (transferred) will be observed with Holy Communion on Tuesday, April 10th at 5:45 p.m., following shortened Evening Prayer at 5:30 p.m., in the Round Church.

“The Feast of the Annunciation falls, naturally, nine months before Christmas, which marks our Lord's birth. The Annunciation commemorates the angel Gabriel's visit to the Blessed Virgin Mary to announce that she has been chosen by God to bear his Son. We are this day reminded of the obedience of Mary to the will of God, and we contemplate the wonder of God becoming Man. This is not simply a feast of Our Lady then, but, as Athanasius points out, is one of the chief feasts relating to our Lord Jesus Christ.”

From *Common Prayer*, Vol III.

“This festival bespeaks a double motion: the descent of the Word, and the rising up of earth in fruitfulness... St. Mary is, as it were, the fulcrum of that double motion. The rain of grace descends: ‘Hail, thou that art highly favoured; Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee.’ And earth rises in response: ‘Be it unto me according to thy word’. All is the work of grace - *sola gratia* - yet grace presupposes nature, which it heals and elevates and transfigures. As St. Thomas puts it, ‘Grace does not destroy nature, but perfects it.’”
