## Induction of the Rector

The Rector's formal Induction will take place on the Feast of Saint Matthew, Friday, September 21st at 7 p.m. in the Round Church. More details about the service will be announced as the date approaches.

Last March, Father Hatt was formally "Instituted" as Rector by the Archbishop. The "Institution" is a brief service in which the bishop commits to the priest the responsibility for the "care of souls" within the parish.

The "Induction" is a public recognition of the new rector, by the people of the parish, in which the new incumbent is given responsibility for the "temporal affairs" of the parish, and in which priest and people pledge to work together and uphold one another in prayer and mission.

## Fall Reading Group

Dr Wayne Hankey, Emeritus Professor of Classics at Dalhousie University will lead a reading group in the parish again this autumn. The group will consider Jane Austen's *Persuasion*, Graham Green's *The Quiet American*, and Dorothy Day's *From Union Square to Rome*. Dr Hankey writes, "We shall consider them as offering different answers to the ancient Hellenic and Christian idea that humans cannot act without doing evil." The sessions will be held on Monday evenings at 7 p.m. in the Round Church, beginning on September 10th and continue to the end of November.
