Dr Wayne Hankey, Emeritus Professor of Classics at Dalhousie University will lead a reading group in the parish again this autumn. The group will consider Jane Austen's *Persuasion*, Graham Green's *The Quiet American*, and Dorothy Day's *From Union Square to Rome*. Dr Hankey writes, "We shall consider them as offering different answers to the ancient Hellenic and Christian idea that humans cannot act without doing evil."
